

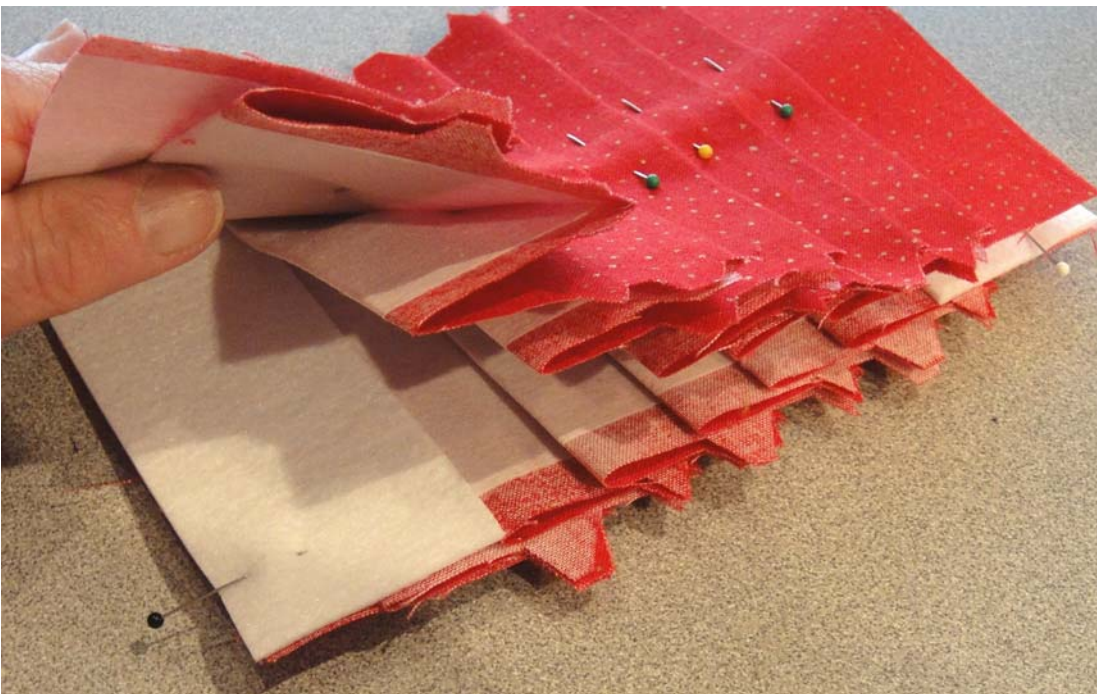

### For step 29-32

### Finishing CC Caddy

You'll need to secure a piece of Peltex on the wrong side of either end of ONE of your Caddys. There are fewer layers of fabric and interfacing at the Caddy ends and the Peltex will serve to stabilize the area. Don't bother fusing it.



Now get your 2nd Caddy and place it WSD on your 1st Caddy concealing the Peltex at the ends.



It's tough using a regular zipperfoot to stitch the two Caddys together. I recommend using a zipperfoot.



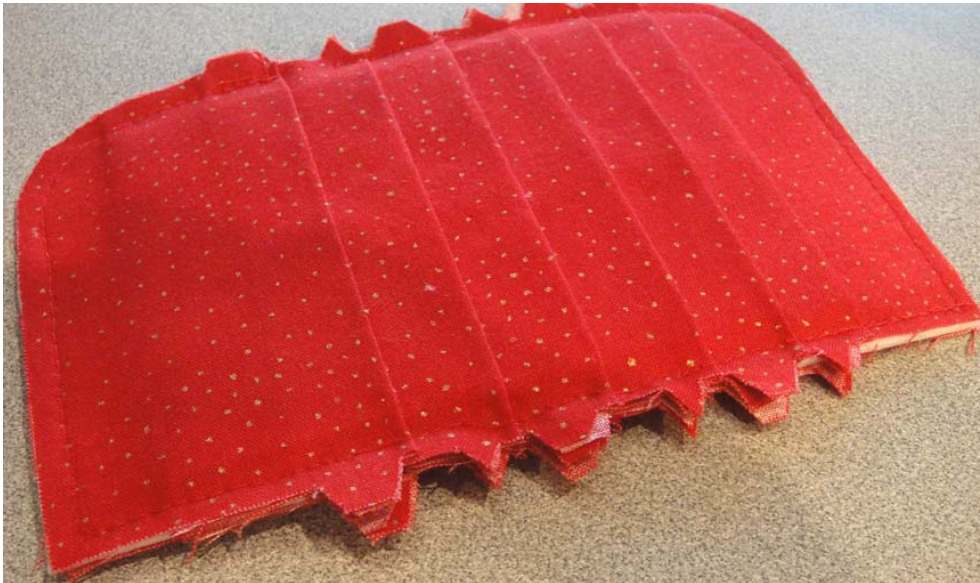
Notice that I locate my needle on the left side, which allows the zipperfoot to 'ride' on the area of the Caddy that is less thick with layers.



Here's how the side view looks. It's easier to see how the Peltex in between the layers balances out the overall thickness of the Caddy.

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### Additional pictorial help For step 29-32 (cont.)



Here's our completed Caddy, ready for the elastic.



Anchor both of your elastic ends on one side of your Caddy. It'll help keep your cards in place.

The twill tape tab can be optional if you prefer. It doesn't serve a mandatory function but it is an easy way to add a little extra color contrast. :)
