



## the Easy Go Wallet

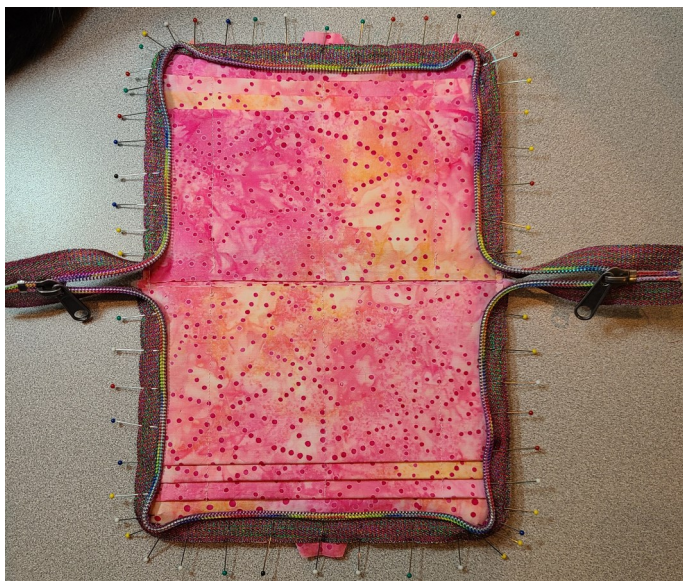
### Steps 21a-21b

#### Inserting the Zipper

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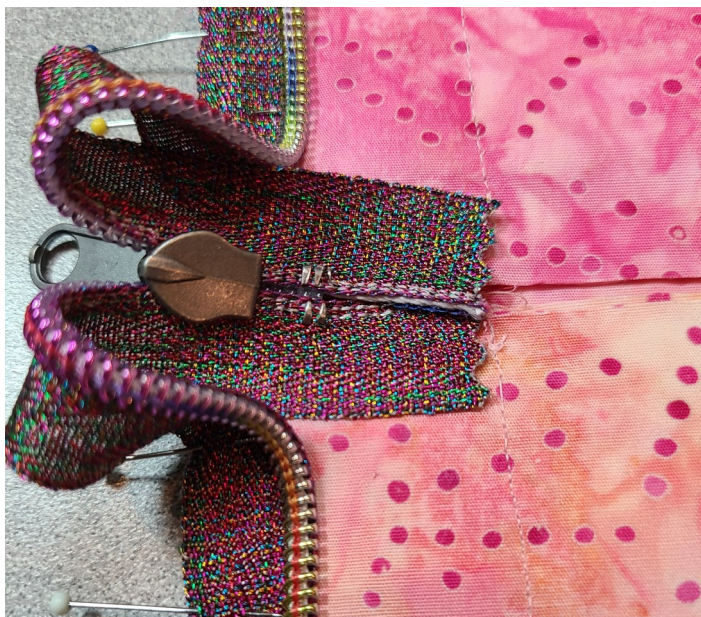
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21b) OK— here's how your project should look after getting is all pinned in place. Notice that BOTH zipperends are hanging off the side edges and this is NOT the look we're after here! :)

We need to get those zipperends on the INSIDE of this wallet BUT, we can just bend them backwards or our zipper wont operate correctly....so....



21b) In order for the zipper to operate correctly, we need to flip zipper ends **RSD & INTO** Wallet area so zipperpulls are face down and away from outer edges. To do this you'll need to pull the zipperend UNDER itself (*at left*) to center of wallet. Now your zipperends should be end-to-end along centerline of Wallet with the pulls WSU (*above*).



21b cont) Now you can stitch a scant 1/4" from edges (*using a zipperfoot*) around entire Wallet perimeter thru ALL layers. DO NOT trim or clip into zipper edges and set Wallet aside for step 24.
