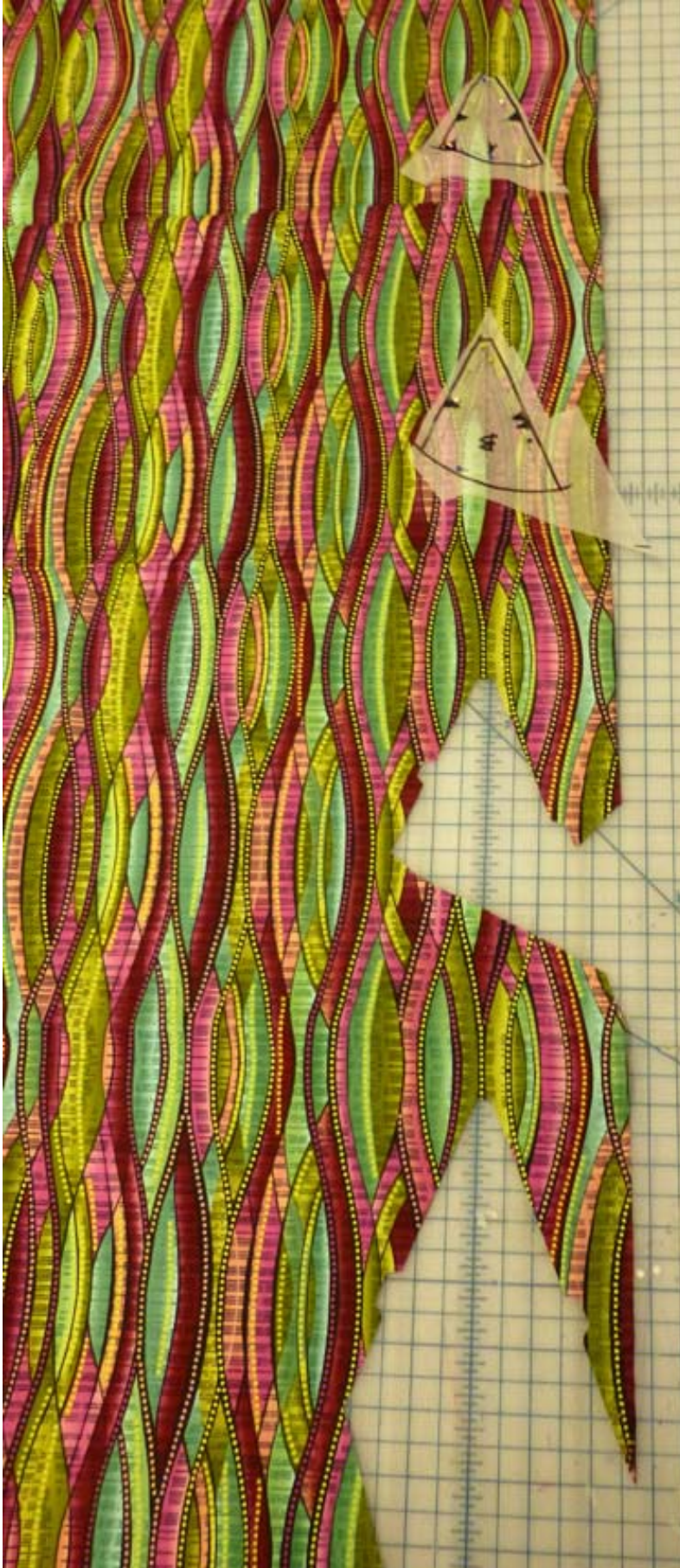


# Piecing Together a Kaleidoscope OverFlap



*I included this picture to give you a little peek at an easy way to line up your design elements in order to achieve a kaleidoscope effect.*

*First of all, this is near impossible to achieve without first making copies of these little pieces on tracing paper (otherwise you can't see the fabric underneath).*

*Just utilize the dotted "grainline" indicated on your pattern piece and align it with the same design element for each and every one of your pattern pieces.*

*But remember... when you flip your pattern pieces over to create the other side of your OverFlap, your objective is to create the "mirror-image" of the other side of your project!*

*And yes- depending on the repeat of your design element, this procedure CAN eat up a LOT of fabric. (The finished result is generally worth it though!)*



## *Piecing Together a Kaleidoscope OverFlap (pg 2)*



*Here's how our pieces look after they are cut out, and if we line them up like this, we get a little sneak-preview of our completed look.*



*Here a shot after all 4 quadrants of our OverFlap were stitched together.*
