

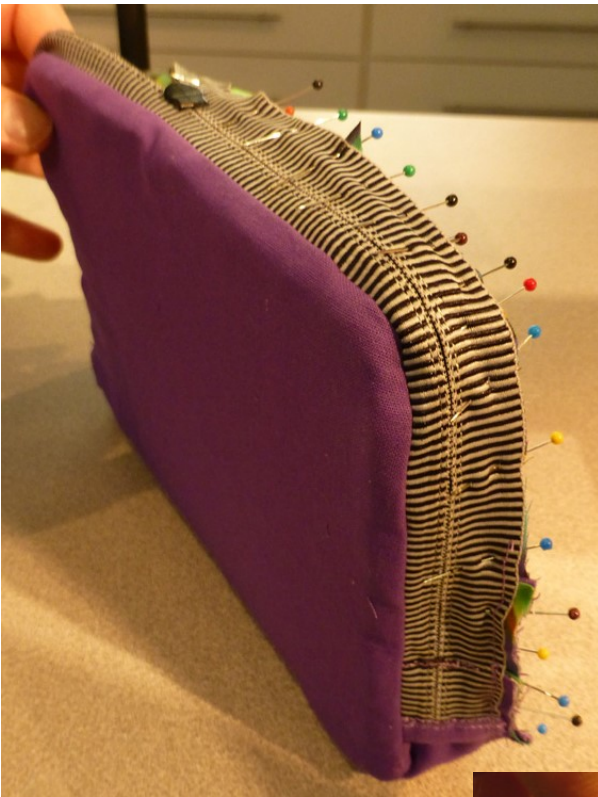
Zip Pouch (part 2)- steps 20-21



The most important thing to remember as you start into steps 20-23, is that this stitching is best accomplished if you break it down into a 2-3 step procedure... and remember, do not at any time allow your Zip pouch to be zipped completely closed (don't ask me how I know this) :(

So anyway, all 3 of the pictures on this page were taken of the same stitching effort, but from different angles so you can get a better idea of how it looks when its done right.

At left, the mag-snapped Zip Pouch is being pinned in place to the left free zipper edge (RST). You might note that the zipper is open on the right side.



At left: here's how it looks from the other side of the pouch, prior to any stitching...

And below: here's how this same area looks from above, now pinned in place across the entire bottom edge, up the left-side and partially across the top.

I generally choose to stitch JUST this area in place FIRST.



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With 3/4 of the stitching accomplished, I can now remove my pins, **MOVE MY ZIPPER HEADS** over to the stitched side of the Pouch, and pin the rest of the Pouch Top in place.



As before, here's another view of the newly pinned area. Once this is stitched in place, it will be then secured on **ALL 4 sides**.

And here it is (below), still inside-out, but completely stitched in place.

Now only have to get our last Zip Pouch in lining pinned and stitched and the Zip pouch will be finished!
