Applying the Roo Edging



Step 9– Place Roo Pouch lining side down onto right side of InnerRoo/Yokes. Pull on both ends of pipings until Roo Edging lies flat against each Yoke.



Step 10– Once you're happy with the look of your Roo Edgings, stitch across all four Roo Edging ends (thru pipings and InnerRoo underneath) at a point <u>5/8"</u> from each Bag side edge AND top edge. Reinforce this stitching. Please note that this stitching will be visible, so choose your thread color wisely.

Step 11- Once stitched, peel back each Roo edging opening to expose the cording at the stitch line. Taking great care, clip off the cording now, close to the stitching. Be real careful not to cut into the edging or the Inner Roo or Yoke during this step.

Step 11b—Here you can see the end of the piping (inside the Roo Edging), and that it is more than 1/4" from the side edge of the Pouch. This is important, because we DO NOT want the cording to be involved in the 1/4" seam allowance, That would make the seam WAY too bulky.



Step 12– Once the pipings are stabilized, go ahead and stitch close to the rest of the Roo Pouch edges, to secure them in place. Now you can even stitch across the Roo Edging openings.

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
